To the royal family of the King of KwaZulu at St. Helena.

Zililo and Hlabangana are reporting that Mutokwane falls sick more often. Ndubazi's kraal was struck by lightning. Maxegu is sick because of the wound he got from Zibebu's war. The doctor took out a bullet from his wound yesterday but is still sick. During that day the lightning struck all the corns of Mubangazi of Vuma's kraal. They now only eat spinach because there is no food. Mutokwane is sick and stays with us.

To the royal family of the King at St. Helena.
Ndabezitha !

We safely received your letter and the two letters from the children. We thank you so much. It's so pleasant to see the letter written by the Prince's own handwriting. It has also been sent to Nkosazane to see it too. Ndabazezwe & Mushumayeli arrived, and Ndabazezwe reports that the girl Mvungunya went away with her father ^{died} Cekela. Five bulls died at Mukulwana's house. Ten calves we had this year all ^{died} at Minya. Ten sheeps died at Mulandu, Mashobongela and Gampokwe. Six goats died at Mubuzo. The bride of Mfingwana is sick with chest trouble. Dubana of Matumbendlovu died and the cause is unknown. Gwababa's wife also died. Fulathela's wife is sick with chest trouble. Mabayeka's mother died and the cause is also unknown. A buck, ground hornbills, eagles and a tortoise entered Minya's upper huts. Mushumayeli also reports about the bulls at Mahashini that they also died, and also the bull Moyi died in the middle of the bushveld. The people and the cattle are finished. This is the message from Ndabazezwe & Mushumayeli.
