Description: Crossbar: Rectangular, curved, and decorated near the flattened, narrow ends with a row of zig-zags carved in relief.

Lugs: Small flat pentagons, facing sides, and decorated with two rows of chevrons carved in relief.

Column: A single rectangular pillar, decorated, front and back, with four horizontal, rounded pleats.

Base: Two flat, linked circles.
