Situated on northern banks of the Mhlatuze lagoon where the Nzwakele is visited by Issacs (father of Habana). The chief survived Shaka and Dingsiwayo but was murdered by Dingane and his people scattered into Natal. Nqoboka, chief of the Sokulu, warned Nzwakele's Chief Wife who bore Habana at his kraal posthumously. Cetshwayo and Mpnade got to head of him and summoned him but he fled to Natal.

Dingane instated a Zungu (two in fact) one of which was killed by Mpande. Habana returned in Cetshwayo's reign but the chieftainship remained in the hands of the Zungu Madlebe who had been killed by Mpande.

Madlebe, of Mgedeza (Zungu) was sent as 'viceroy' of the Dube by the king (Dingane):
 Mpande killed him and his son's (Lokotwayo) minority Palane, of Motinwal
 of the Mkwanazi as regent.

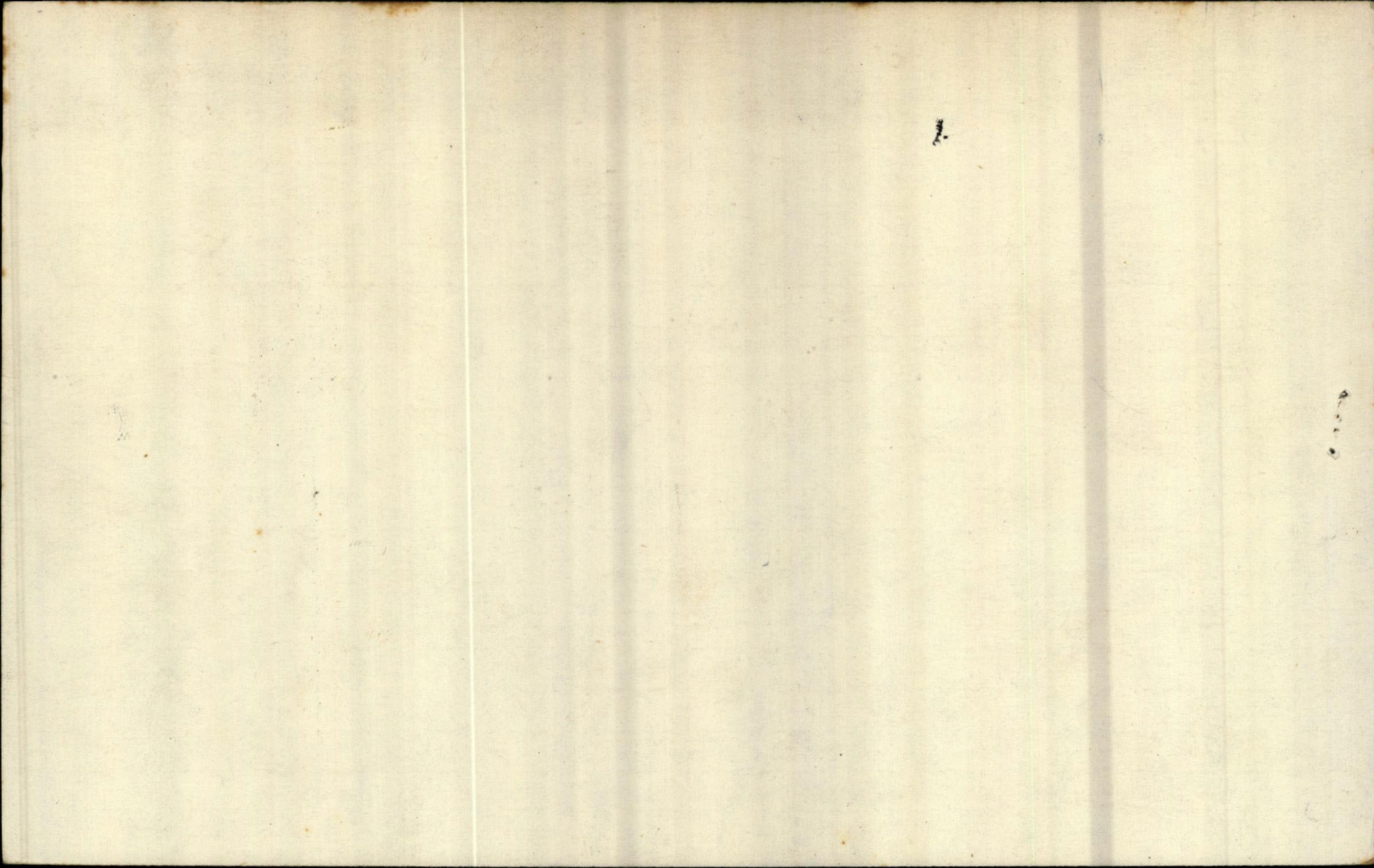

Principal kraal, Dayingubo, is on the wagon road from Rorke's drift at the Umhlat^usi river. Is favourable to the English: being very rich and the King having ill treated him. His son, Umizo, married a sister of the King.
