ATB 274 "On the Zulus' western side, over by the esiPezi mount, dwelt the clan of the aba-kwa-Koza (of Bayisa)

Conquered by Shaka sometime between 1820-26 when the clan was under Mbiwa Under an 'inferor' son much of the tribe went north and joined with the hordes of Mzilikazi, Nxaba, or Soshangane.

Another son (the heir, Maqwebelende was killed, and another son, a Child, and full brother to the heir, was adopted by Lukwazi of the Ntombela The Koza who remained became to be headed by by Nqungqulu when he found favour in Shaka's army.

Ngoza later murdered by Sikonyana (in collaberation with Cetshwayo?)

WBut pre-eminence in the clan remained with Sikonyana. In later years he dwelt with the Biyela near Eshowe. He supportee Mpande in His revolt against Dingane, and was afterwards appoinnted by the former a district headman near Eshowe. Ther he died in 1874, leaving as heir Mfokazi married to Mpande's daughter, Popaza, unblessed with issue. To supply for the deficiency, a daughter of Mgebisa, son of Joko, of the Makoba clan, was affiliated to Popoza's house, and bore a boy, Mehlwana. When in 1877 Mfokazi died, Mehlwana became the family heir, and married & daughter of Cetshwayo. During Mehlwana's minority the reg3ncy was held by Ntshingwayo






