
ATB 37 Could have been related to Zulus at an early stage. One tradition states that the Mbatas descended from Mpangazita the son of Mageba, and therefore close to the Ntombelas as well.

102 Attacked by Dingiswayo but the Mbata ✓ "under Kali, son of Shandu, were likewise honoured with a visitation about the same time; but by a judicious retirement to their stronghold on the Ntlazatshe mount they evaded defeat. Nkomo, however, Kali's younger brother dwelling by the esihlalo mount" ✓ was killed ✓

221 ... Jama and Shandu (who lived 'over the river') had a duel from which ~~they~~ Shandu and the Mbata got their names (!?) Tradition has it that they, like the Ngwane and the Kumalos 'came down from among the Sutus. Others say that they are an off-shoot of the Zulu and only married in Jama's time. (see re to p37 above.) The man who set them up as an independent clan was Shandu but their roots are, as can be seen above, confused.

223 Shandu was the son of 'Ndaba' and defeated his brother Mbeje for the throne. He and his people settled along the Mfolosi on the opposite side to the Zulus ✓ "from the Sihlalo-Mabedlane line to that of the ~~Nx~~ Ntlazatshe-Mfolosi"

Shandu had ~~1~~ sons. Mbudlele the legitimate heir, Kali who seized the throne from him, Mngunyaná the iKohlo son who with his brother Mandlovu sired the 'White Mbatas' (the other sons started the 'Black line')

Another son Nkomo moved (perhaps at the time of the dispute) moved ~~fix~~ and ended up subjecting himself to Tshana of the Zungu and settled near the isihlalo mountain. Here was killed, (Sihlalo) after Dingiswayo had failed to make contact with Kali. (who was to be dealt with by Shaka). The sections under Mbudlele and Mngunyana (living on both sides of the White Umfolosi offered allegiance to Shaka.

Under the Kings Mbata supplied many of Shaka's great warriors. Manyosi son of Dlekezele, victor of the battle of Gqokli hill Retained position of royal cook under Shaka and Dingane but fell from favour on Mpande's accession

Conquest of Kali's faction. Mangcengeza his son now chief and Mtshana (of the Sisini) and Sitayi (of the Gazini) and Mqalane (of the Nzuza) attacked and the chief fled after spirited resistance to East Griqualand

Incorporation Dilikana of the Nkomo branch came forward and found favour with Mpande who died with his son Simukanaye at Ulundi 83
