"We were unable to obtain any news of C. though we found the inhabitants perfectly friendly & peaceable." / / We were now in the centre of Somkeli's district. Up to this the country was very sparsely inhabited; but directly open ground was reached kraals were seen studded in all directions. Bieng again unable to get information from kraals, we turned our steps towards Somkeli's kraal, which we reached about 4 p.m. This chief received us very ceremoniously, & although quite friendly, did not appear to be impressed in any way with the fact that he had been defeated, or to have suffered from the consequences of war. He ~~was~~ professed his utter inability to assist us, & assured us of the impossibility of C. being within his territory."

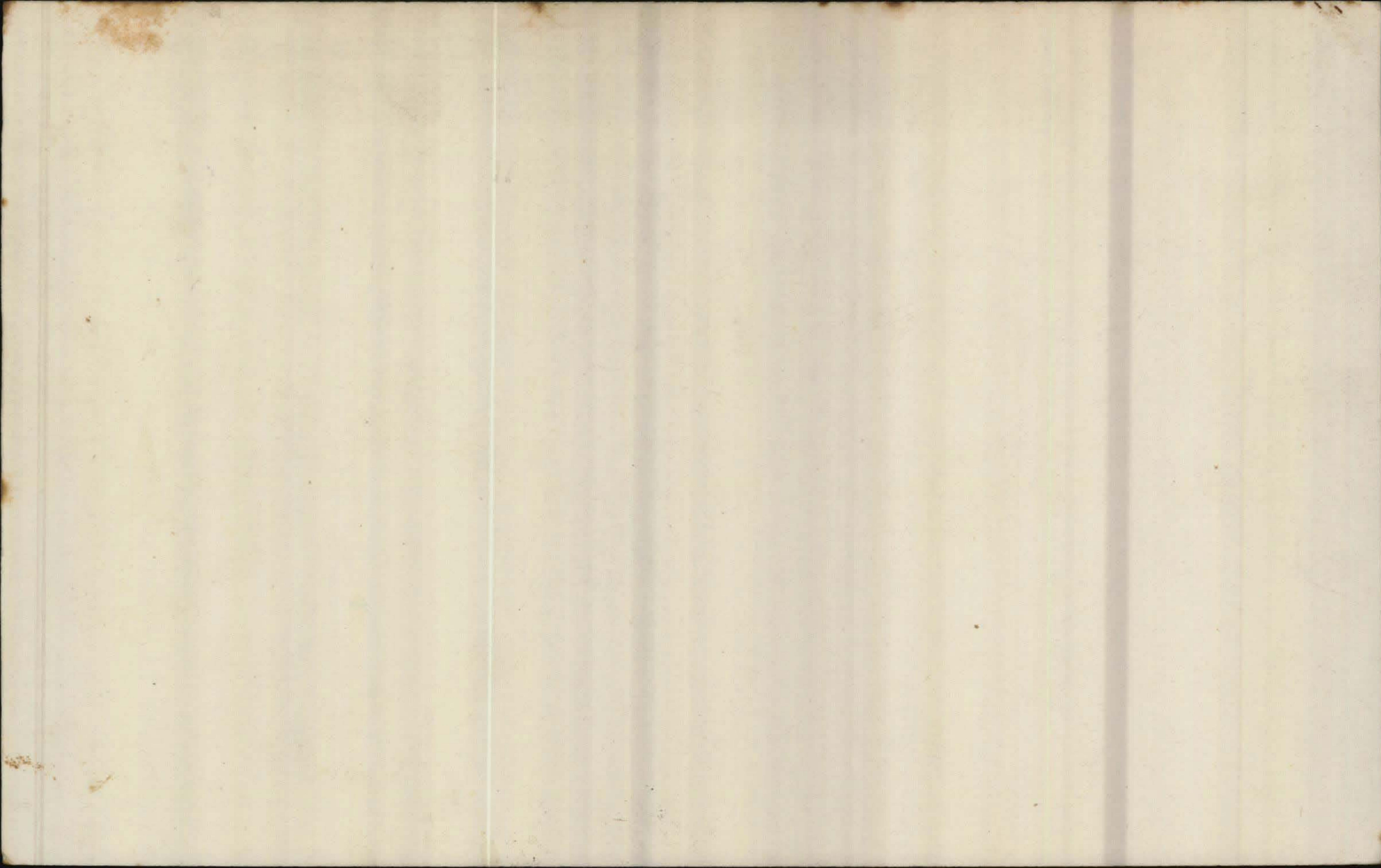

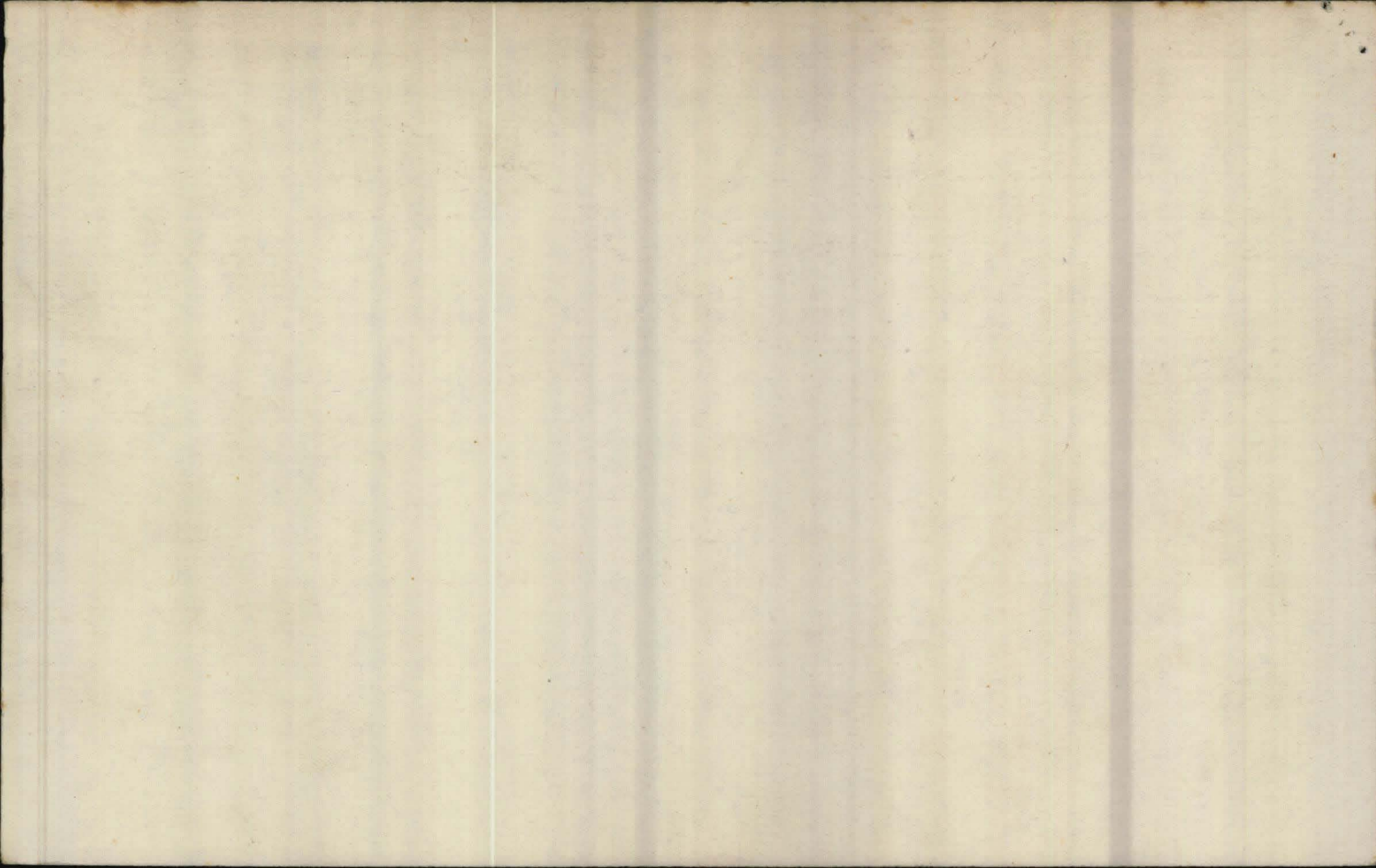

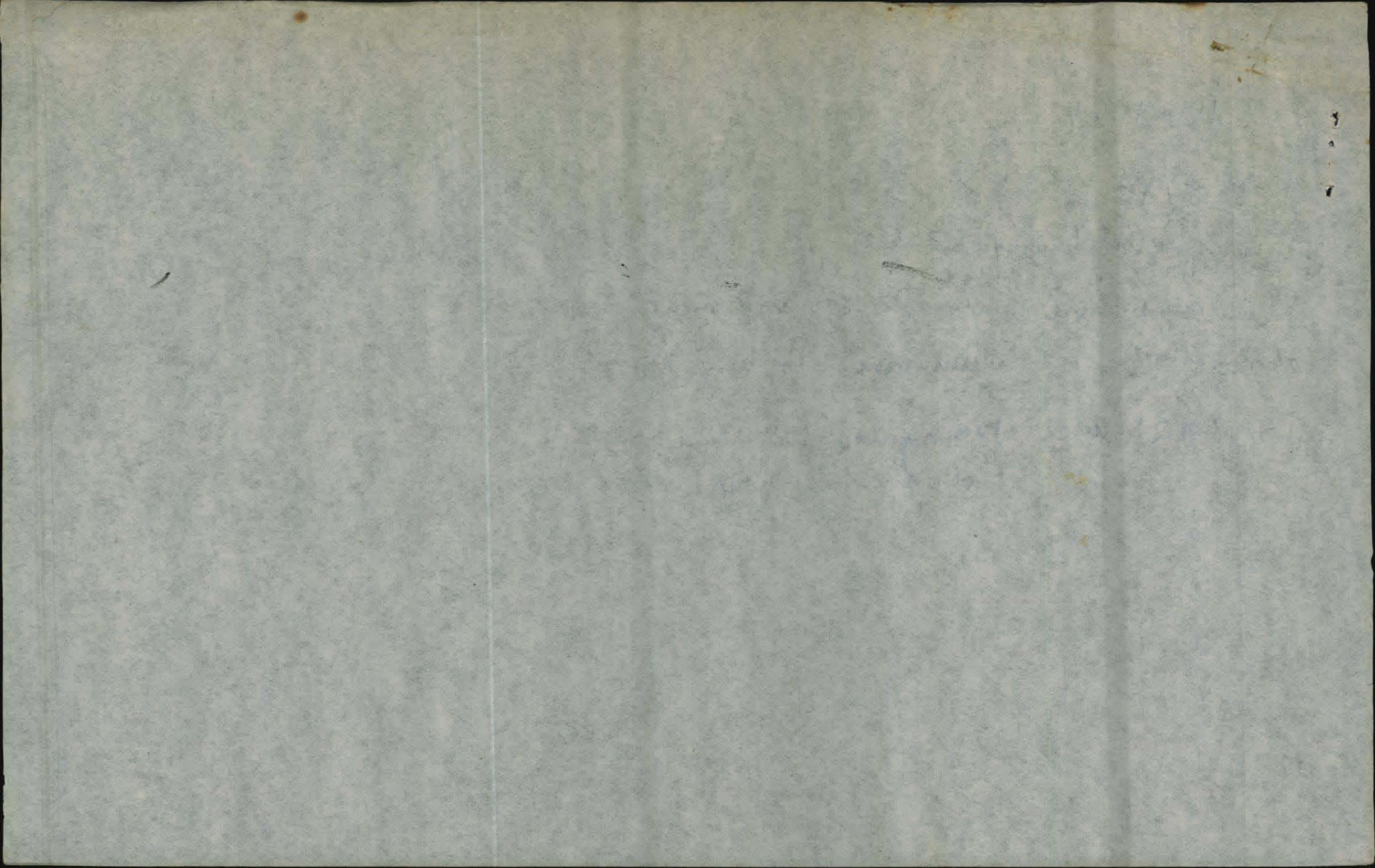

Letter from G Esserty to K Campbell 21/7/54

Ulundi was named after the Drakenbery (Ul-ondi the end of the land) and signifies impenetrability. Cet's first Ondini was near Shaka's Buluwayo kraal upper Mhlatuze and was established 1857. On the death of Mpande Cet moved this Ondini kraal to the Ntukwini river a trib of the W Mfolosi to a spot just below Nodwengu. He then erected his own Nondwengu kraal nearby_
