The proclamtion of 14/5/87 declares that ist is bounded by Amatongaland, the name given by geographers to the country to the north of the Umkusi and Sordwana bay. It has been said that Cethswayo did not regard Usibondi and others as being in Zululand that they paid tribute to him like Zambile did. It is said also that Amotongalnd covers the territory north of the Umkusi East of the Lebomob as far as the Umbeloosi river and Delagoa bay where as Zambile's people (Mapootas) claim only half of that territory. It is said that there is danger that such Chiefs as Usibondi, Begesi, Zambane, M'Tsilogwan, Umgwaman, Ex Fagoot, and Umghenti, have offer to place themsevles under the Portugues at the instigation of Zambile. This would lost us Sordwana. I don't think much of the all this but and your procaliantion of 9/12/88 answers most of the questions as it declares the territotries of Sibonda and Umcamana as part of Zululand but when you have the chance go into the problem of the northen boundary. /

"The country we claim as ours is hounded on the South by the North shore of St Lucia Bay to where the Umkuzi river enters the bay: thence up the Umkuze River to where it passes through the Libombo range; thence along the first foot of the Libombo, on the East side, to the Umbeluzi River, creax crossing the Pongolo and Usutu Rivers at the foot of the Libombo; thence down the Umbeluzi River to where x it takes a bend to the north; thance straight across to a place on the Tembe River, where there is now a ferry; thence down the Tembe River for 3 or 4 miles; thence it goes to the sources of a small stream in Mafokoti Forest, dwon which it goes to the sea / We call ourselves the Amabudu: our Tribal name is Mabudu. he Portuguese know us by that name, and it was they who gove the name of Maputa to what we clalled and knew as the Pongolo river; Maputa was the way in which they called us. We should be called the people of Mabudu. The Zulus gave us the name of Tongas having overcome us. the name is got from the fact that the Amatongwana nuts from which snuff boxes are made come from our country.
