/* The Mapootaland Syndicate has expressed doubt on the exact position of the northern boundary of Zululand. The proclamation of 14/5/87 declares that it is bounded by Amatongaland, the name given by geographers to the country to the north of the Umkusi and Sordwana bay. It has been said that Cethswayo did not regard Usibondi and others as being in Zululand that they paid tribute to him like Zambile did. It is said also that Amotongaland covers the territory north of the Umkusi East of the Lebomob as far as the Umbeloosi river and Delagoa bay where as Zambile's people (Mapootas) claim only half of that territory. It is said that there is danger that such Chiefs as Usibondi, Begesi, Zambane, M'Tsilogwan, Umgwaman, ~~for~~ Fagoot, and Umghenti, have offer to place themsevles under the Portugues at the instigation of Zambile. This would lost us Sordwana. I don't think much of ~~all~~ all this but and your procaliantion of 9/12/88 answers most of the questions as it declares the territotries of Sibonda and Umcamana as part of Zululand but when you have the chance go into the problme of the northen boundary. /

Ncamana ~~is~~ Defeated by Tshaka and has paid tribute

Fokoti, Umgindi and the late Manaba There peopoe are sections of the Amatshabam independt before Shaka until defeated by him and have konsad to the Zulu kings since them. After the war the latter konzad to Z and because of this was killed on Z's overthrow by N^Dabuko's order. He was the hereditary Chief of the Amatshbam.

Sambana has always been a Zulu subject, His people killed Kingane. Has alswys konsad to the Zulu kings.

Ungiza His tribe the Umgomezulu was independent until defeated ~~by~~ Zioidi ~~After~~ After the defeat the memebers fled north with the Ndwandwe who were also defeated sic. The Swazi king interceded on their behlf and the tribe under the late Lubelo was allowed to return to their old district on the Tugwavuma iver and have paid tribute to both Zulu and Swazi kings. To the Zulu they konzad through Mapita and Z until on Z's overthrow they were attacked by Sambana on N^Dabuko's order it is said, and had to retire north of the Inwavuma iver, the Swazi King refusing to give assitance as he said they were Zulu subjects. Since Z's retoarion they have konzad to him. None of the Tonga indunas asseert that these chiefs ever konzad to them.

/I have not taken the complicated relationships between the British Tonga Sambile and the Portuguese but the following statement is interesting. /

"Statement of the Tonga messengers Mafobiyana Kwezi and Nondabula regarding the boundary of their country &c.

"The country we claim as ours is bounded on the South by the North shore of St Lucia Bay to where the Umkuzi river enters the bay: thence up the Umkuze River to where it passes through the Libombo range; thence along the ~~first~~ foot of the Libombo, on the East side, to the Umbeluzi River, ~~crossing~~ crossing the Pongolo and Usutu Rivers at the foot of the Libombo; thence down the Umbeluzi River to where ~~it~~ it takes a bend to the north; thence straight across to a place on the Tembe River, where there is now a ferry; thence down the Tembe River for 3 or 4 miles; thence it goes to the sources of a small stream in Mafokoti Forest, down which it goes to the sea / / We call ourselves the Amabudu: our Tribal name is Mabudu. The Portuguese know us by that name, and it was they who gave the name of Maputa to what we called and knew as the Pongolo river; Maputa was the way in which they called us. We should be called the people of Mabudu. The Zulus gave us the name of Tongas having overcome us. The name is got from the fact that the Amatongwana nuts from which snuff boxes are made come from our country.

Smabana and Umbikiza are Swazis: we do not know whether they acknowledge Umbandeni as their Chief: we know that they used to Konza to the Zulu Chiefs.
