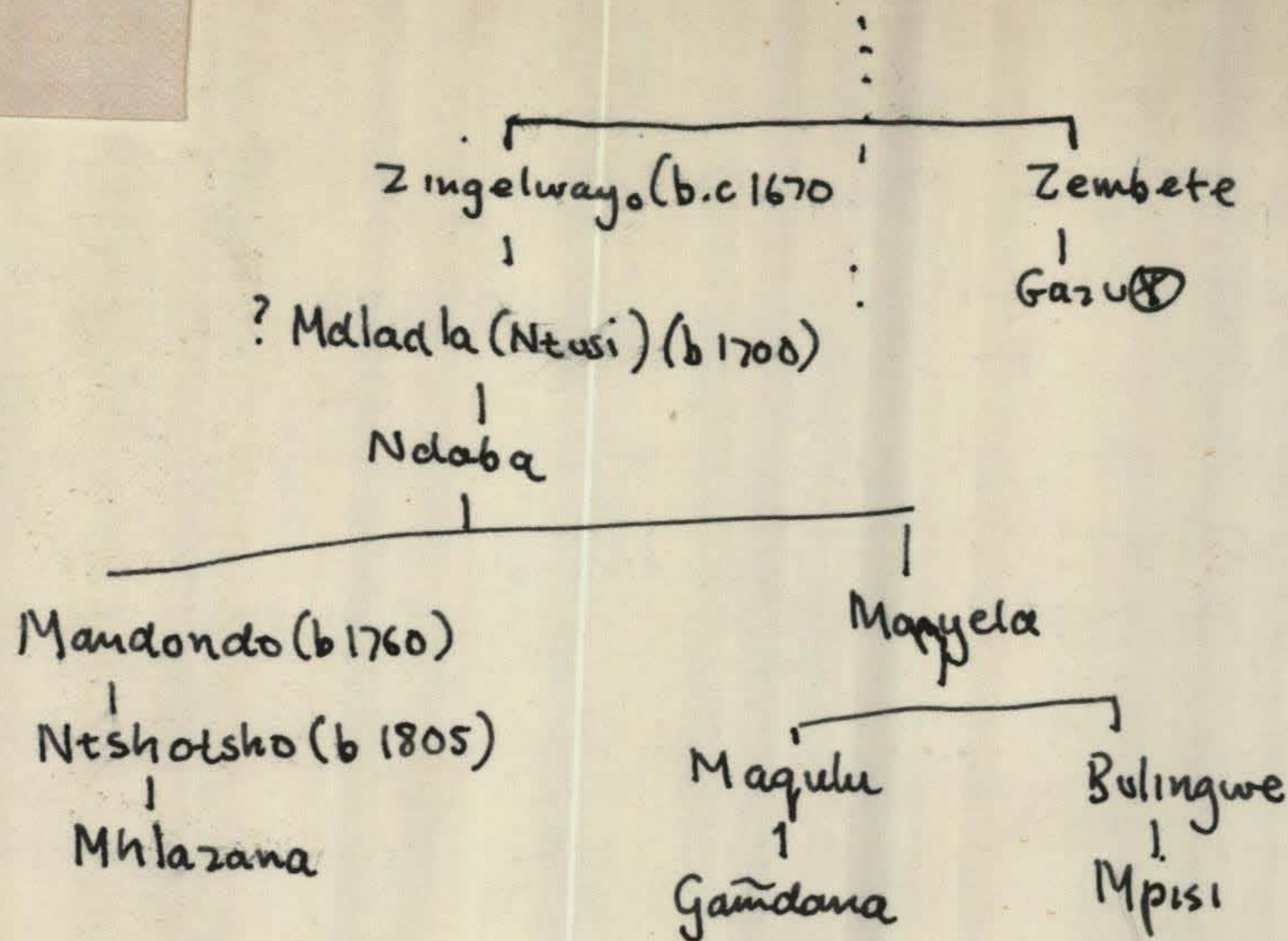

ATB 26 Early history obscure) perhaps related to Malandela or Bapepezeni (father of Zungu and Makoba) - sharing Malandela's 'cognomen - Gumede' were two brothers Zingelwayo and ~~Zambete~~ Zembete (or their father' arrived at much the same time as the first Nguni ~~xxx~~] "at the Mpembeni, the brethren severed partnership, Zembete elcting to test fortune with Bapepezeni, Zingelwayo with Malandela" [Zembete did not cross the Mfolosi and built a hut on its southern bank below the Mkumbane and his son Gazu begat that section of the clan. (Some believe Gazu to be the son of Mhlelo and thus a Zungu)

"Zingelwayo accompanied Malandela.....From the top of the Mtonjaneni heights the cast their eyes abroad and beheld the settlement of Zulu in the valley right directly before them. That way being barred, they turned along the Mtonjaneni ridge, and, coming to the eGumeni hill at the end of the ridge and overlooking the White Mfolozi, there they settled. [and spread along the river until they reached the Zulu, Gazu, Zungus and emaMbateni Intermarried and remained continuously friendly with Zulus. Manyelela's daughter Mntaniya was mother of Senzangakona. Aided Shaka militarily from the onset of his conquests

389. Dingane's headman - placed over a section of the Dlamini along the "Lower Bushman River" Sotshi was son of Mpangalata.

495. 1838 Br. sailors raid royal cattle in care of Sotshi near Krantkops.

521. Sotshi - Dingane's representative on the Nadi stream.

546. In response to white pressure Dingane had appt Sotshi of the Gazu Sibiyas as Gov. Genl of the inland districts of Natal & recalled his people from Natal coast.
[Note Dingane recalling people from where they might be "danger" i.e. in journey with whites. Cf. S'mani's point about communications - they were out of touch.]

560 One Dingane's border guards Sotshi on the Nadi.

616. One of Shaka's ambassadors in 1828.

666 Sotshi acquiesces to Shaka's assassination.

671. Sotshi After Dr Shaka's death Sotshi ^{was appointed} ~~remained~~ as G. General of Natal So/Tugela had & moved from the Ulalazi district in Z land to the upper Nadi.

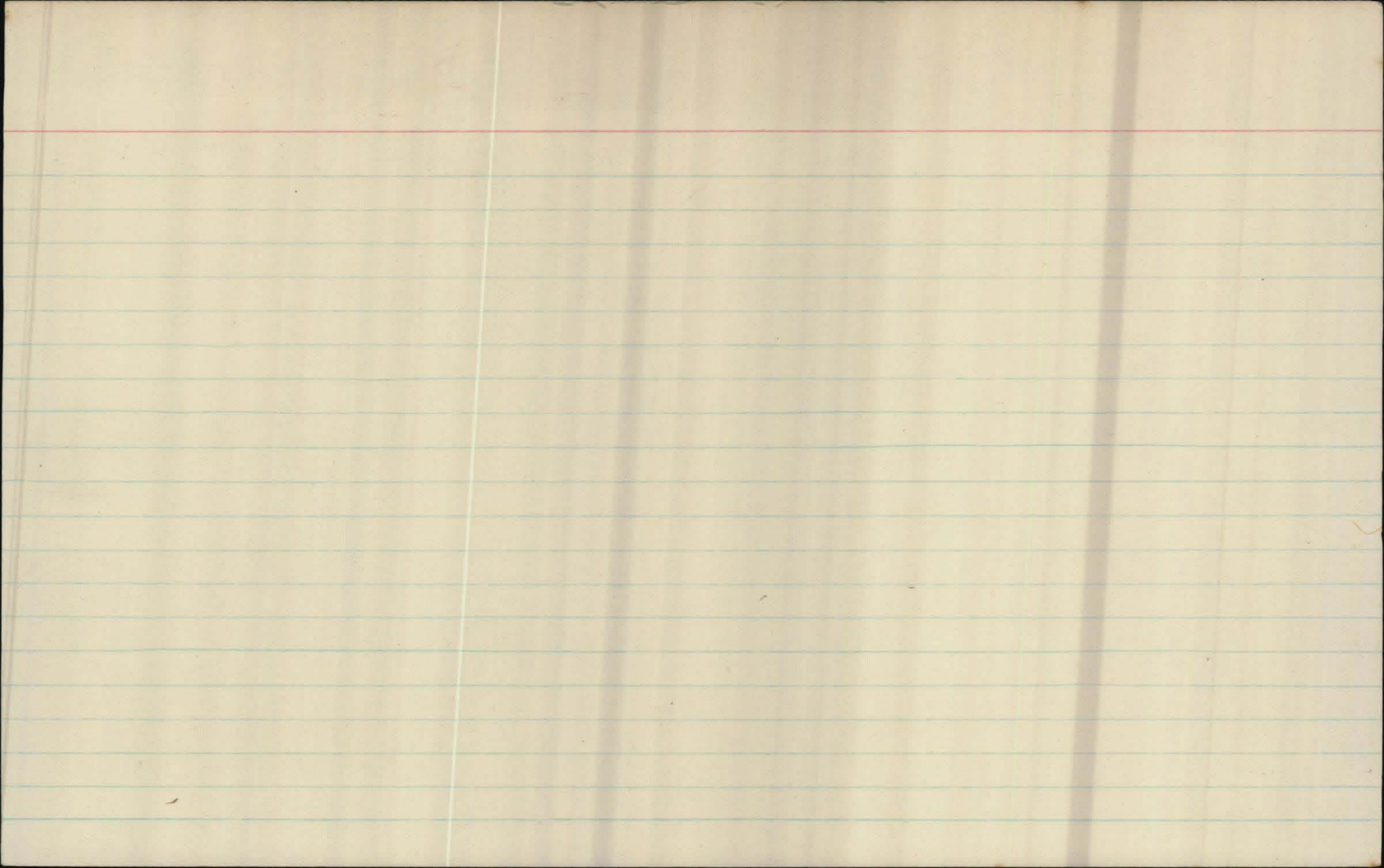
