Somhlolo has somehow got the ntx notion that he should have been made chief of the Territoy and is now agitating towards Mgitshwa's deposition. I have explained to thim that theBritish govt having conquered Zululand has the perogarive and apointed Mgitshwa. Mgithwa tells me that does not interfere with the succession to chief of his father's tribe but he intends to keep his appointemnt over the Territory in which that tribe resides to which he was appointed.
