[A possible sub-branch of the amaNgweni was the Linda - 'present' representative Tinta son of Didiza, of Wome, of Mandlana, of Nkomazana. Some of these Linda people] "under the headship of Mdolomba, son of Ntshotsho, of the EmaNgweni royal house" (along the W. Mfosi - beyond the Ntlatzane mt. For whatever reason Cet. is said to have called them aba-bwa-Cebekulu (the family of Cebekulu).

[Best known member was Mzimba (son of Gobo, of Nomagaje, of Kuzwayo wa-s-amaXoshe, induna + warrior in Shaka's amaWombe regiment. Shaka appointed him headman of Babawayo district, then to the amaTigulu on the coast, then between the Mkatuzi & Ntseleni. Under Dingane. Then apparently moved up country. Was ruled by Mpande?!

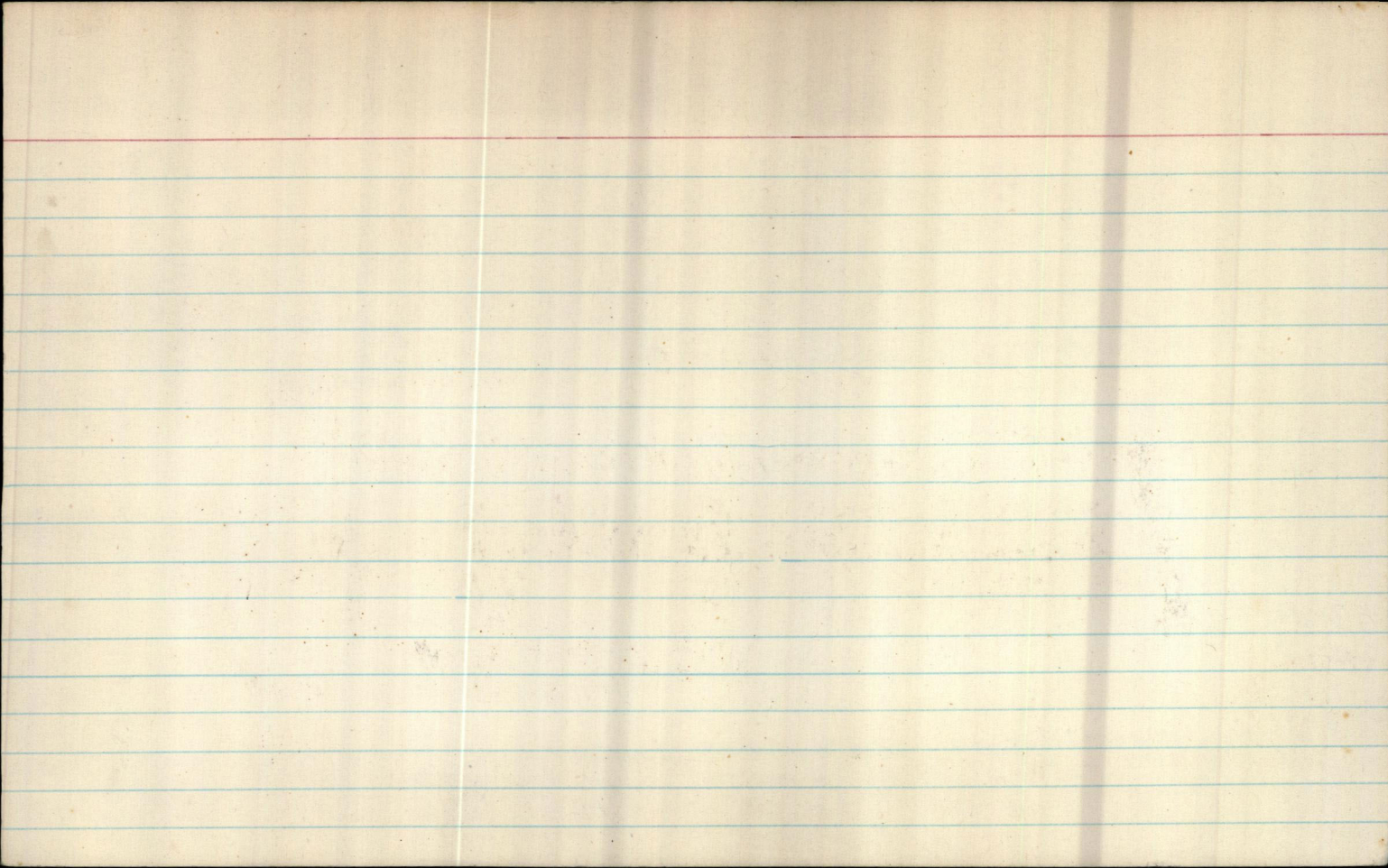

Abatembu Tribe, under the Chief Msiyane, Lower Umfolosi District.

Somopo, the father of the present Chief was Chief Induna of Cetshwayo's Mangweni Kraal, on the Okula Stream. About 1890 Somopo was recognised as a Chief by the Zululand Government over the people belonging to the Mangweni Kraal not under other Chiefs, and Msiyana, the present Chief, on his father's death, succeeded to the position.

The Cala, a small tribe under Njamine, at their own request, was amalgamated with the Abatembu about 1890, and now form a portion of that tribe under Msiyane. The tribe paid hut tax in 1903 for 378 huts, viz., £194 12s.

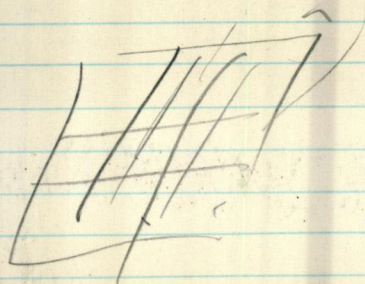

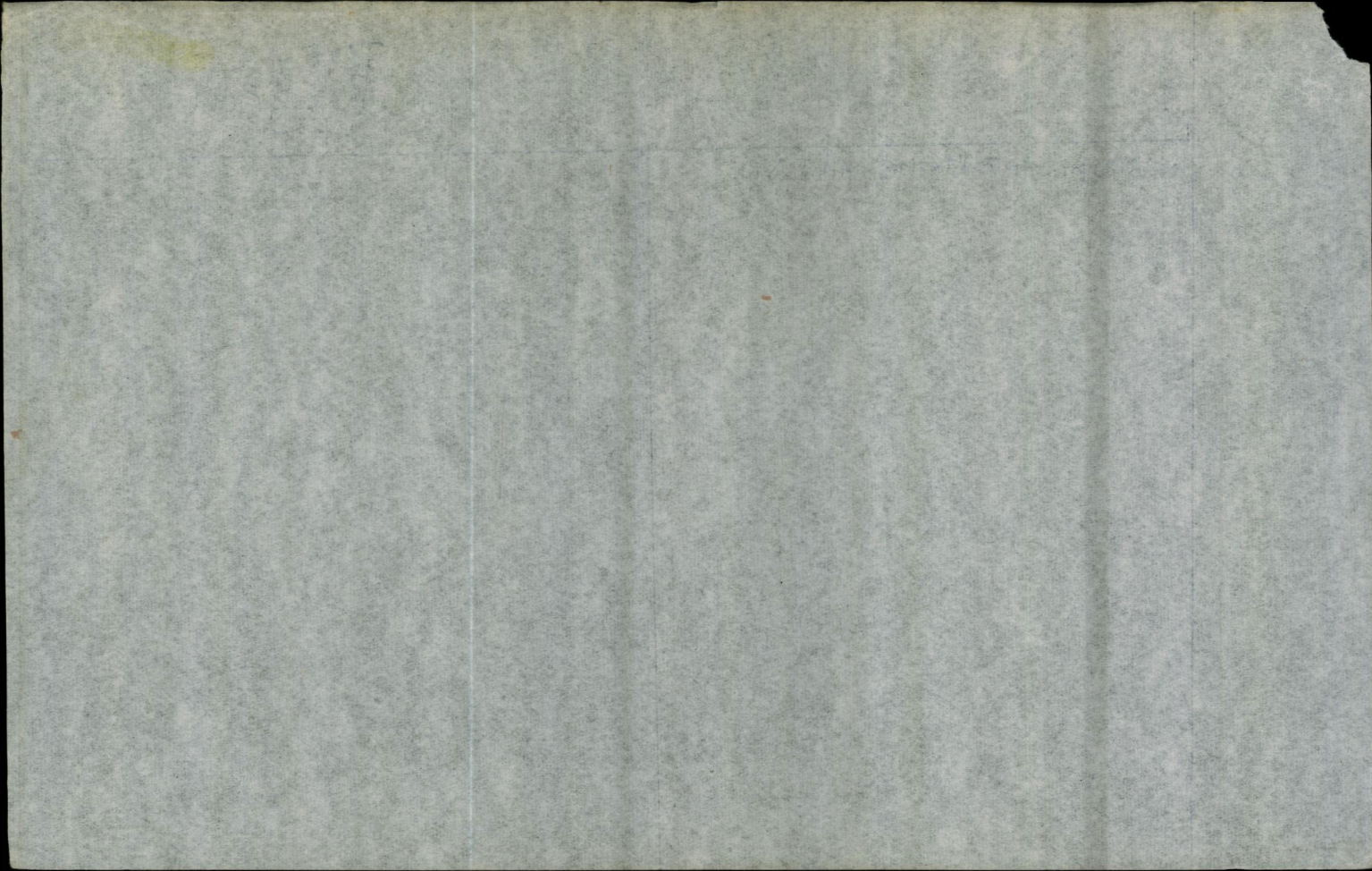
Cebekulu Tribe, under the Chief Mkonto, Lower Umfolosi District.

This is an off-shoot of the Zulu Tribe. Mzimba, the grandfather of the present Chief, was one of Tshaka's Indunas of the Maombe Regiment, and in recognition of his personal bravery and the good services the Regiment had rendered, was awarded the District the tribe now occupies. The tribe has occupied these lands for three generations. During the tribal wars, after Cetshwayo's restoration, Bizo, the then Chief, fled into the Reserve with a portion of his people, and remained there about two years, but in 1888 resumed occupation of his tribal lands, and the people have remained in undisturbed occupation since then. The tribe paid hut tax in 1903 on 168 huts, viz., £117 12s.

Sir Waleter Hunt Grubbe 13/7/85_

The boat gets swamped four drown and they decide to walk to Durban. Begin at 1 p.m. walk till 8 p.m. Begin again at 5 am on the 30th June No asistance from locals and stapped at about 7 pm and succeeded in lighting a fire. July 1 walked till 2pm when they came to Bejana's kraal. Here a native called Johannes Cingale who spoke some English saw them and said he would talke them to a white man across the river. The chief and he consoutled and the chief then rode away and we were told to wait. Given a little food at 5pm. 2/7 told to wait and given a little food. 3/7 the chief said we could go but had to pay ~~money~~ 20/- to 30/-. Drew up agreemnt at Johanees's desire and left at last and on reaching th river (Mfolosi? surely the Mhlatuse) I was told to corss and then come back with the money. Crossed river and found Blamey and Toohey and gave

money and food. Walking was now out of the question as some of the party had done the whole journey bare footed and wh borrowed a waggon in which we were driven to Dunn's house arriving at 9pm. Most hospitably recieved. Traveeled on a ~~con~~ ~~the~~ south in waggon lent by Dunn and crossed Tugela on o 5/7
