Customs, Ingwavuma district. Per Mtshodo, 25.10.1897.<sup>1</sup> The custom of marrying off (ganisela) young children is very common in the district. [I knew this of myself before Mtshodo acquainted me thereof.]

37 Mtshodo says that he knows that children, even children not yet born, are given for marriage (ganisela'd). A beast is generally paid as a sort of 'retaining fee', or as indicating good faith. If a boy is born, the boy is looked upon as the man's 'wife' and is held as a guarantee for a future girl to be born. This custom is at variance with what is done in Zululand and even Swaziland. [Examine further.]
