Notes

Nearly all the conversations listed here are those recorded in the published volumes of the *James Stuart Archive*. Not every single conversation is listed individually. The word ‘etc.’ indicates a sequence of conversations, sometimes with extended breaks in the sequence.

This list does not yet take notice of the following: 1) records of a small number of conversations which have not yet been published in the *James Stuart Archive*, and which are scheduled for publication in a volume of addenda ; and 2) records of the engagements which Stuart had with interlocutors who provided him with ‘stand-alone’ praises, i.e. praises not accompanied by ‘conversations’ which the editors could incorporate into the published volumes of the *James Stuart Archive*. These will be itemized in later editions of this list.

Stuart's early career

James Stuart (1868-1942), was born in Pietermaritzburg, and grew up in Greystown and Ixopo. In 1881-6 he attended Hurstpierpoint school in Sussex. After his return to Natal he held the following appointments: February 1888, clerk in the post office, Pietermaritzburg; 26 May 1888, clerk and interpreter to the resident magistrate, Eshowe; 1 February 1889, clerk and interpreter to the resident commissioner and chief magistrate, Zululand; March to August 1895, Acting British Consul in Swaziland; 1 September 1895 as magistrate in Ingwavuma (until 31 March 1898?); October 1898 to March 1899, second appointment as Acting British Consul in Swaziland. For the next two years Stuart was acting magistrate for short periods in various centres in Natal: Pietermaritzburg, Umzinto, Stanger, Durban, Mpendle, Pietermaritzburg again, Howick, and Ladysmith (where he was stationed from September 1900 to early 1901).

From early in the rebellion of 1906, Stuart was an Intelligence Officer with one of the columns of the colonial forces. After the rebellion, from September 1906 to June 1907, he was secretary to the Natal Native Affairs Commission. He was government representative in

the second Zulu orthography conference, held in Pietermaritzburg in 1906, and the third, held in Durban in 1907. On 1 July 1909 he was appointed Assistant Secretary for Native Affairs in Natal.

After the formation of the Union of South Africa on 31 May 1910, Stuart was transferred to the Pretoria office of the newly formed Department of Native Affairs. He retired from the department on the pension which became due to him in June 1912. He then lived with his mother in Pietermaritzburg, and devoted himself to research and writing. In November 1912 he travelled to London to finish his *History of the Zulu Rebellion*, and to oversee its publication. He arrived back in Natal in August 1913.

In April 1914 Stuart had made a short tour of Zululand with Sir Henry Rider Haggard. In July 1914 he sailed for London to act as cultural adviser for a play based on one of Haggard's novels. War broke out in Europe during his voyage. He apparently joined the Home Guard in London; beyond this, very little is known about the time he spent in war-time Britain. He was back in Natal by early 1916.

In 1916 Stuart married missionary assistant Ellen Smith in Ladysmith. In the second half of the year he was actively engaged in recruiting in Natal for the South African Native Labour Contingent. In February 1917 he left with a contingent of the SANLC for the theatre of war in France. He held the rank of captain, but virtually nothing is known about his service record. He returned to South Africa in December 1917, and later moved with his wife and two young sons to live in Hilton near Pietermaritzburg. In 1916 he had begun soliciting and recording accounts of the past from African interlocutors for inclusion in a series of isiZulu school readers that he was planning to publish. He engaged actively in this work for the rest of his time in Natal. In 1922 he left with his family to go and live in London.
