

There are a number of people who contacted me about the digitization of their histories. Almost all these people are happy about the digitization. However, there are concerns about the availability of the information all over the world. This I think will be raised in the closed stakeholders meeting. There are those who have specifically requested copies of the digitized materials. Their names are listed below;

1. Martin Dlamini, Director SBIS, requests that the digitized SBS cassettes and oral interviews be also deposited at their institution. They are hoping to broadcast the digitized materials. Their own cassettes were destroyed when their old buildings were burnt down.
2. Bongani Soshangane Nxumalo requests digitized copies of his interviews.
3. Bongani Lukhele requests digitized copies of the Lukhele history. He is representing the Lukhele chiefdom, Ngobelweni under Chief Dambuza Lukhele.
4. Chief Mbiko Mkhonta II requests digitized copies of the Mkhonta history as related by Magoloza Mkhonta and others.
5. Mancoba Dlamini of Gundwini requests digitized copies of the history relating to the Gundwini Royal Kraal. He comes from that royal house.
6. James Mncina requests digitized copies of the Mncina clan in the northern Hhohho region. He is representing the Royal Kraal and is curious about one of the interviewees, Guzana Mncina.
7. Thulani Mngomezulu requests digitized copies of the Mngomezulu clan history. He is representing the Mngomezulu Royal Kraal of kaNtunja.
8. Thomas Magagula requests digitized history of the Magagula clan. He is representing the Magagula of Madlangempisi. He is a retired history teacher who also writes on certain aspects of Swazi pre-colonial history.
10. Elliot Gamedze requests digitized history of the Gamedze clan. He is a Gamedze from Siphofaneni currently working as a Private Secretary in the Ministry of Economic Planning.
11. Dr. Barnabas Sibusiso Dlamini, Prime Minister of Swaziland - He requested to have digitized copies of Magangeni Dlamini's interviewees. He explained that he is the executor of Magangeni's estate and that he was responsible for looking after Magangeni's children. He is also interested in the history of the Dlamini of Ntunja as he is a descendant of Somcuba.
12. Timothy Velabo Mthethwa - The Indvuna and governor of Ludzidzini is requesting the digitized copies of Mandanda Mthethwa's interviews. He is a descendant of Mandanda Mthethethwa.

13. Mr. Nkomeni Ntiwane a former senator of the Swazi government has requested Magangeni Dlamini's interviews. He also has an interest in the history of the Ntiwane that he says was articulated by Magangeni very well. He grew up at the Sobhuza's royal kraal at Lobamba.
