FUDGE
AFTER a week's excogitation of a reply to an article which appeared in our impression a fortnight ago in the proceedings before Mr. HOLLAND in connection with the Registration, the *Kaffrarian Watchman* has attempted a leader made up of arguments the most milk-and-watery that have ever been offered as mental pabulum to political babes. We should not be noticing the composition now but for the excuse it affords to emphasis once more the glaring defects of the lamentable decision, in an effort to defend which the journal which bears the device "Nunquam Dormio" seems determined to exhaust all its grotesque exercises at evasion. As is now pretty generally known that the findings of the Civil Commissioner were based on Mr. BROSTER'S opinion, the *Watchman* very properly strains every nerve to establish that gentleman's bona fides. But, very unfortunately for it, it has failed most egregiously to do so. In the place of honest, straightforward argument, we are treated to ill-concealed tricks. Let us for a moment address ourselves to the extremely easy task of tearing off the veil under which it is sought to hide the honest facts of the case. It is deemed important to tell us that "an examination of the public records of the Registration Court shows no such testimony given by Mr. BROSTER as to setting a value of £16 upon six-acre lots." May we ask our contemporary, at whose disposal "the public records" seem to have been placed, why, when, and by whom was this examination of the records made? Whether it was before or after Mr. HOLLAND'S decision was given? And, if before, whether it was because there existed a doubt as to Mr. BROSTER'S previous valuation of the Natives' lots as given before Mr CHALMERS. If, however, the examination of the records has taken place since the ruling of the Civil Commissioner, then, pray, has it been from any wish to in a measure redress the grievance of our people if it was discovered that Mr. BROSTER did say that the value of the Natives' erven was above £6? That before Mr. CHALMERS Mr. BROSTER appraised these very lots at £2 10s per acre needed no reference to the public records at the Civil Commissioner's Court at all; as the whole information could—without undertaking a pilgrimage to the Court involving the self-imposed and thankless task of rummaging through dusty, musty, archives there—have been found within the boards of the *Watchman*'s file of 1890, in the issue of our contemporary of January 20 of that year of Grace. Therein it is recorded as follows: "At the Court on Tuesday "the Sworn Appraiser valued the land at £2 10s. per acre, and the Magistrate accepted this." Does the *Watchman* pretend to deny that this was ever uttered in the Court of Justice of Kingwilliamstown by Mr. BROSTER, the Sworn Appraiser? But such affectation of ignorance does not appear to have availed the *Watchman*. "Oh, what a tangled web we weave When first we study to deceive!" In the sentence following that denying all existence of the record, it is artlessly stated by the writer that "Mr. BROSTER was not sworn "by Mr. W. B. CHALMERS but "simply made answer to a casual "question put to him, and, we are "assured, this is not on the record "of the proceedings of the former "Registration Court." Of course nobody expected that it would be there, after what the *Watchman* has itself previously said, that the record was not discovered after the diligent search that had been instituted. After trying on this argument our contemporary itself feels oppressed with a sense of its incoherence, and proceeds to adopt another, hardly more ingenious than ingenuous, but to our mind even weaker than the first. Our contemporary's next effort at argument leaves it on the horns of an awkward dilemma, and it is compelled to affirm what it did not intend—that the Natives' lands are absolutely; valueless. We read:—

A field of six acres would in a very good season, reckoning three muids to an acre, yield eighteen bags of mealies, and in good times, when mealies are plentiful, they seldom obtain for them more than 5s. a bag. This represents a return of £4 10s. for the year, but from that sum must be deducted the expense of ploughing and sowing well as the cost of the seed, say altogether £1. To this must be added 18s. for scuffling six acres twice at 1s. 6d. the acre, and 10s. the expense of harvesting and carrying to market eighteen bags. We have thus £2 8s. to take away from the annual return of £4 10s., and there is then left £2 2s.; and if what is termed a fair rental

deducted, two shillings actually only remains as the yearly return from a six-acre lot.

Well, we should not like to insult the intelligence of our readers by demonstrating the utter absurdity of this. But we would repeat the question we put in former references to this subject, why the actual current rents, ranging from £2 10s to £5 annually, and the market values from £25 to £35 of these lots, are passed by; and resort had to ridiculous and impossible calculations which, at best, are hypothetical and of no value at all. Further down in the *Watchman* article we are treated to an argument on the Valuation Roll of the Divisional Council, which shows that the value of these lots have, within the past three or four years been jerrymandered, without rhyme or reason, by militant and aggressive political partisans from £22 10s. to £7. Really it is no wonder one feels tantalsed to be invited to combat frivolous and inconsistent talk of this character, and we must be excused if we apply to it the classic expression of Squire BURCHELL, " Fudge ! "

GREY HOSPITAL.

IT is with no small degree of alarm that the Natives will learn that changes are taking place in connection with the Grey Hospital, Kingwilliamstown, the aim and purport of which may be the ??? dgment of the advantages and privileges which our people have enjoyed from the foundation of the Institution. The Hospital was erected by Sir GEORGE GREY principally with a view to benefit the Natives in an especial degree. For the English and Dutch sections of the community he set up Colleges for the education of the rising generation; while to the blacks, among other gifts, he devised this Hospital. It is no matter for surprise then that our people should look upon it as peculiarly their own; and we do hope and trust that Government will do nothing to impair the capabilities of the institution to do further service to our people. But we confess to an uneasy feeling as to the future of Grey Hospital, due to a fear that the powers that be do not fully recognise the claims the Natives have on the place, and the deep interest they take in it. Ever since the retirement of good Dr. FITZGERALD rumours of change in the management of the Hospital have filled the air. But we have consoled ourselves with the reflection that whatever change was affected under a Colonial Secretary not unfriendly to our people would not be such as to render the institution less beneficial than it has been to the Natives. The matter seemed settled by Mr. SAUER'S answer last Session to Mr. SCHERM- BRUCKER, the Junior Member for Kingwilliamstown. "The Colonel" had asked whether the changes spoken of as being likely to be effected in the conduct of Grey Hospital were mooted by the Government. The Colonial Secretary had arrived at no conclusion on the subject; and we were led to infer matters would go on as before. Then followed Dr. BLAINE'S appointment as successor to Dr. FITZGERALD—an appointment which, by the way, does not appear to have been popular with the Natives. To this step is to be added another which bears a suspicious look about it. We learn that all the old employees of Grey Hospital have received notice that their services will be dispensed with in another month or two. All we can say at this stage of the matter—a matter which is likely to cause a stir among the Natives in the neighbourhood as great as any that has happened before—is to express sincere regret that Government seems to have resolved upon dealing with the Hospital in an off-hand fashion as if no broad claims of policy were involved in their action; and we do hope Mr. SAUER may be dissuaded from acting in a hasty manner in what he intends to do with the Hospital, as vested interests have to be considered in any new scheme of management.

THE VENERABLE ARCH-DEACON WHITE'S CONTRIBUTION.

THE Venerable Arch- DEACON White's contri- bution on this subject LABOUR which appears in another portion of this number, is of supreme moment; and is worthy of all consideration at the hands of the Government. Until the new Labour Department entrusted to Mr. Stevens was mentioned the day nothing had been done by the State, directly or indirectly, to solve the question of lab ??? if we except the attempt on an email scale made last year by the Government to introduce Damaras as members of the divisions in the extreme west. It was left to employers or employed to make their own terms, and in many cases unscrupulous people availed themselves of the ignorance of labourers to cheat them; the results being disastrous. Now that systematic organisation of labour is begun under Government auspices, we are satisfied confidence will soon reign; and if, as the Archdeacon of Grahams- town suggest', everything is made to go smoothly with the labourer, the farmer's troubles in this respect will be at an end.

WHILE all must now look to the Government declarations AGAIN Alwal North, yet until then the disclosures of the well-informed as to the main features of the measure cannot altogether be ignored. A Capetown correspondent of the *Eastern Province Herald*, who seems to have his finger on the Ministerial pulse, writes on the Cabinet decision as follows:—"The franchise continues to form the subject of many newspaper articles and much anonymous correspondence. The Government, have, however, given no indication of their intended proposals. Until these are announced it seems somewhat like hunting a shadow to debate the question in any but the most general terms. Meanwhile it must satisfy those who are opposed to Mr. Hofmeyr's proposals to know that there are at present no rumours as to any impending change in the Cabinet. While Mr. Merriman, Mr. Sauer, and Mr. Innes remain in the Government we may rest assured that native interests will not be entirely overlooked; and I learn from reliable sources that nothing will be done which will in any way prejudice the rights of voters who have their names at present on the voting lists. For further particulars we must await Mr. Sauer's visit to his constituents at Aliwal North."

THE FREE STATE NATIVES.
