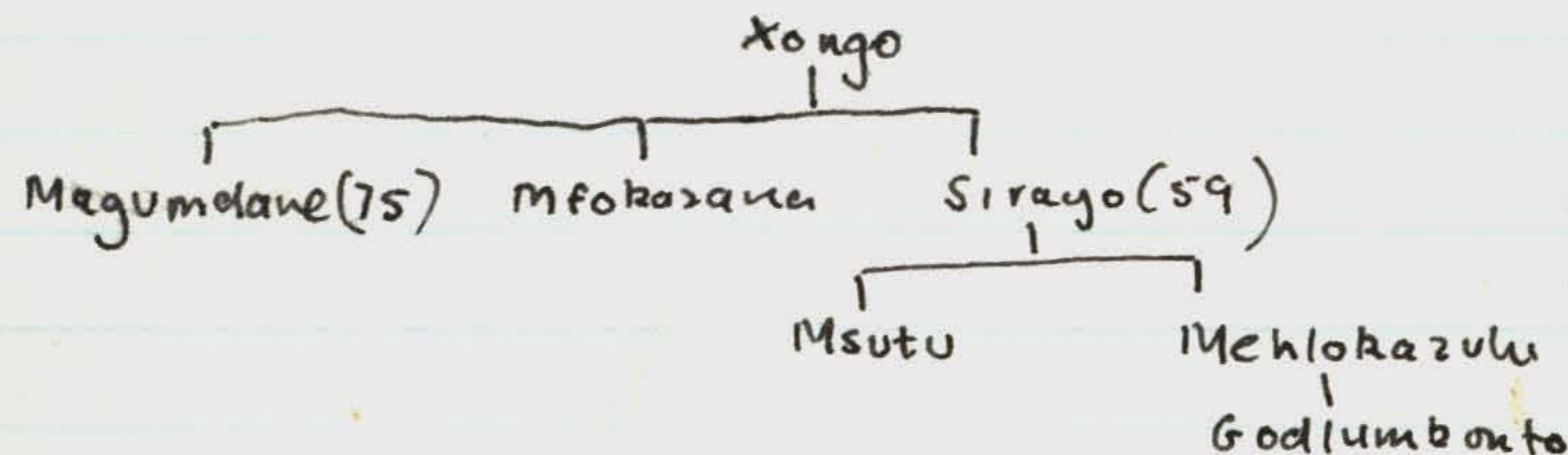


Qungebeni (i)

Qungebeni

ATB p26. [Amongst the earliest of the Nguni clans to settle in what was to become Zululand. Resided between Mpembeni and White Umfolosi]

p129. [Evidence confused, particularly by what would seem to be divisions of the clan in the time of the Zulu kings. Peacefully assimilated, but traditional lineage ended perhaps by Dingane. Sirayo (59) chief in 1879 - line 'raised' by Mpande.]

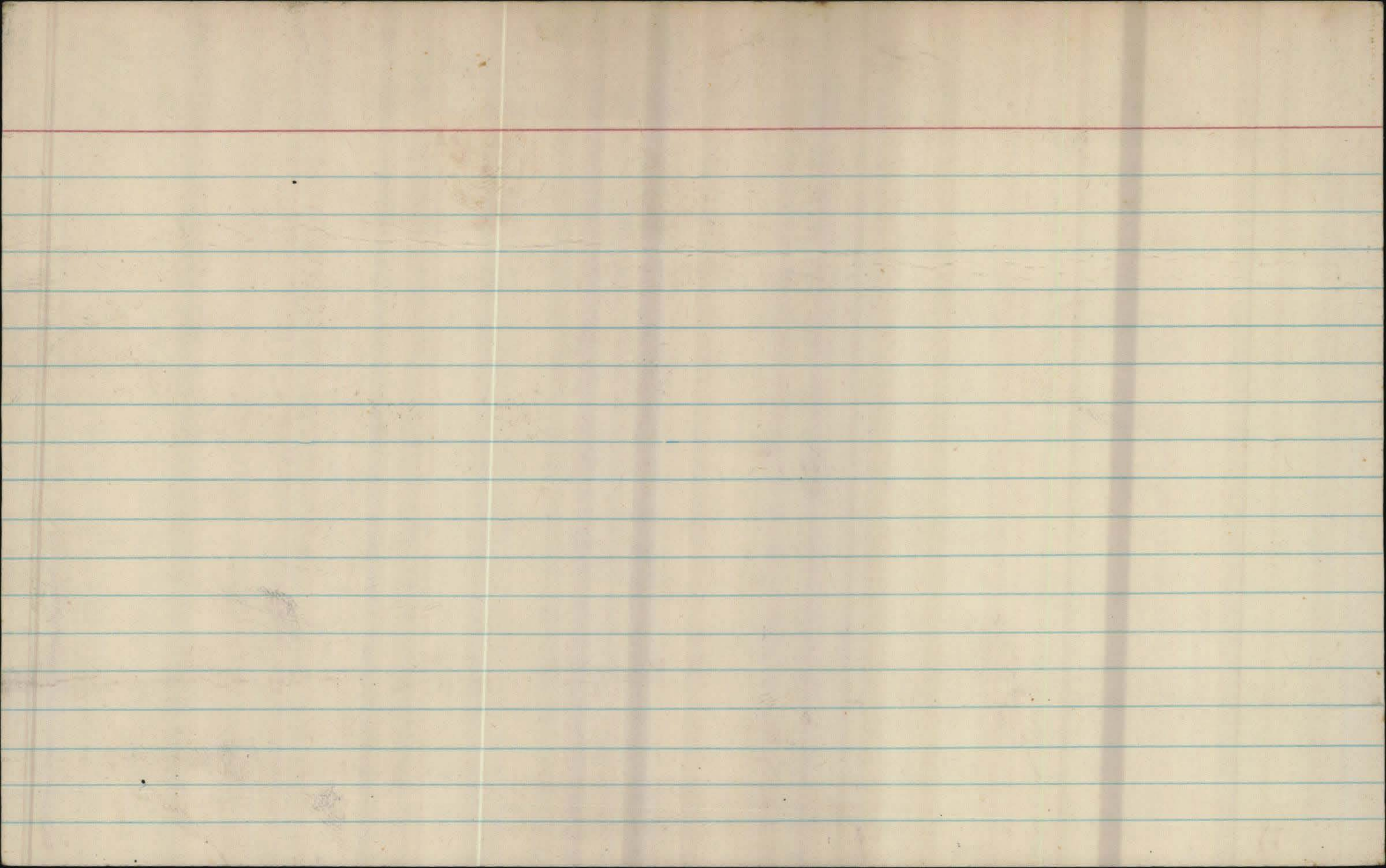

ZA79. "Father: Xongo. Age:55. Residence: On Buffalo border, chief kraal, 'Usokexe', opposite Rorkes Drift. Said to be fortified. Remarks: Is the chief of the King's household, and an officer of the Undabakaombi Regiment. Has about 3000 men. The King's greatest favourite. By his advice Cetshwayo purchased guns, and horses were first introduced into Zululand. Tribe said to be warlike and he to be a treacherous, cunning character disliked by other chiefs"

C3863, pl56 "Rank; Chief. Tribal title: Qungebe. Head Chief: Cetshwayo." [Killed Ulundi, 21/7/83]

ATB pl30. Chief of a section of the Qungebeni (?) Son of Xongo and took chieftainship when brother Mfokozana died heirless. Mfokozana 'raised up by Mpande.'

S.P.W64. [Was^{not} an isikulu but induna
He got land]

C3616 *from Mfecane* Sirayo mobilises against & is defeated by Hlubi.
C1137. Sirayo messenger from Cetshwayo to Shepstone

Qungebeni(ii)

Xongo was presented to Sitayi of the eGazini.

Mfozama his son was appointed over Mzimyati / Ngqutu district by Mpande.
Sitayi was his mother. (Note diff between heir and ZAT)

Possible the Mageza is a member of original dynasty. - note that he would follow Hamar

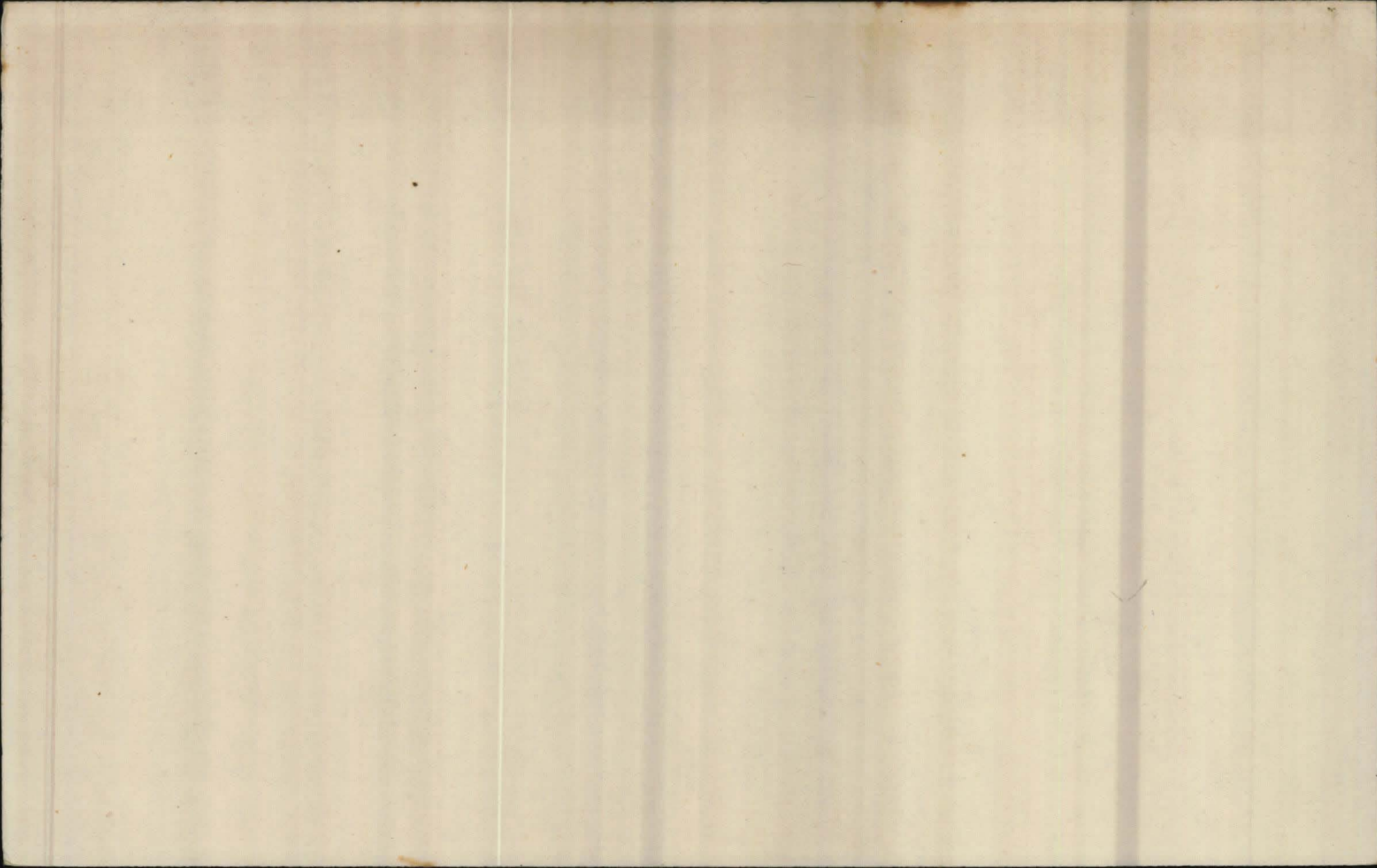
