



"I have come to speak my words which I ask you to wirte down and send to the Governor. I wish the Governor and the other great Chiefs of the Queen to know the things that trouble me and the other people in the country over which Cetywayo has been restored. I am Cetywayo's uncle, his mohter being my own sister, and I do not seek to do him any wrong, as he is of my own flesh. ut I cannot remain quiet after all htat has happened in Zululand since his restoration. Mnay lives have been lost, kraals have been burnt, and cattle and grain have been extensively seized of destroyed. There has been no rest in the land since Cetywayo returned. Many of the people of my own tribe have been killed, their huts burnt, and their cattle taken, without any wrong done by them. I aks, who is to blame for all the trouble. I aks, has Cetywayo observed the laws (conditions) under which the Government restored him. Can it be shown that he has kept any one of them?

when I was removed from my chieftainship to which I was appointed *conclusion of the war, you stongly adives me to remain quiet with my poeple and not cause or join in any distrubance. This advice I followed strictly, but see how I and my people have been treated. ** We have been marked men, and have been constainly threatened with destruction by the sutu, and we should have been killed but for the protection of Gwalagwala ... who alsways did what he could save us from being killed, and property

from confiscation.

the inglish had a great war with the Zulus, and they conquered us, bur showed mercy to us. they different the country into different territories, and appointed me to one of them, in which was included the land belonging to me and my tribe for many generations past, and which was always occupied by us until the late King Mpande complelled us to remove from it, and took possession of it for his own occupation, and built on it his personal dwelling kraals, Nodwengu and others. After him came Cetywayo, who placed his kraals, Ulundi and others, upon the these were destroyed during the war.

On receiving the appointment of Chief at conclusion of the war, I gathered my trive from differnet parts of Zululand, and we re-occupied our old tribal land where we remained undistumbed until Cetywayo was rest red, now many months ago, when I was desired by him to remove with my people to other parts of the territor. Our crops were growin on the land, and we could not move until they were harvested, or we should starve. Whilst we remianed our prosition was one offconstant danger and gross insult.

Meither I nor my people did naything to merit this. We carefully observed all the conditions laid down on my appointment to the territory after the war, and we consider it an injustice to us to be again driven from the land so long occupied by us and our ancestors. ut before we could remove, Usibeby cam and conquered Cetywayo, who feld out of the territory to which he was restored, and is still away from it. e has been dispossessed by sbiebu. This is now the second time that he has been conquered. e has no further rights there, and the land and people belon g to the inglish. I therefore aks the gr at Chiefs of the inglish to allow me and my people to continue to reside on the land we are stiol on now, and that we may be placed under the authority of the Government only. Iask t em to send an Englsih Chief into the country to exercise supreme rule; unless this is done, there will be still gr ater troubles for the people to endure. Among other things famine will result next year, as because of the unsettled state of the epople, they cannot put in corps, and the planing season is now set in. All the Chiefs and people are expecting the overnment to come and establish order, as there is now no head in the country. /164/ The chief and people have until now kept queit because of the messages you sent them conveying the Governor's word desrieing them to sit still, but if something more be no done soon, we shall think that we are abandoned by the Government, and the stronger will attack the weaker.

I do not aks for any reply from you to my words, but beg you will

send them to the overnor and other great Englsh Chiefs."
