The district belonging to Usibepu and ~~Uhamu~~ Uhayana lies north of Somkeli, extending from the lower end of the uBombo to near the Amatonga. He is the second great son of Mapita, holding a somewhat similar position to Usibepu to that held by Ohamu to C. not being on particularly good terms with him, but being strong enough to hold his own. He is unpopular with everybody but the King, and although owning a large number of men, in case of a disturbance but few would follow him in opposition to his brother.

But Mpande said that Mapita knew best to whom the cattle belonged, and that he had never heard of such a thing as a son's disputing his father's decision in such a case. But now Zibebu says he means to have those cattle.

/Info from the Boundary Commission of 1891 on the situation of peoples in the Ndwandwe district/

/Commissioner and magistrate Gibson agree that country between Bl Umf and Ivuna and line marked x x x x on map never formed part of Z's land before the war. This info was obtained from Mankulumana Mgamule and Siziba. 'Usuthu' lived here such as the followers of Umtumbu, Uombe Mgamule Zonyama Ziwetu and others.

To the north - east of this ~~the~~ chiefly in the vicinity of the seat of the Magistracy and between it and the Mkusana (Palaza?) on their own behalf for such headmen as Makedama, Umjwapuna, Manyosi, Sayingana or on behalf of their allies like those who have separated from Z like Haiana or Fokoti.

The possession of these areas has been the subject of dispute since 1879 and Cardew shows how it has been handed back and forth.

The approximate areas claimed by Fokoti to have been occupied before the war are marked on my map. Claimed that this had been under his control since the time of Dingane /Mandhlakazi counter with the argument that the whole country belonged to Mapita as thus Z his heir/

Tinsila, head of the Nzuzo laid claim to the area which included Mpande's kraal Dqukazi, maintaining they were independent of Mapita. The area he claims to have ruled over before 79 is marked on the map. /Remember these are approximations.

(Tinsia~~aa~~ present head of Nzuzo)
Haiyana land marked by Fokoti (see map)

At the time when Mpande assigned the country to the Nzuzo it was deserted in consequence of the Macongo battle between ~~and~~ Dingane and Mpande. The section of the 'Madnhlagazi' which formerly occupied the district was headed by Mkungula and he was killed and people scattered. When Z became chief (79) no Mandlagazi occupied the territory which is observed from the Ndunu hill. The area marked Haiyana on the map was thickly intermixed with Mnadhlagazi in 79.
