

The effects of the late scarcity are still everely felt, and there has doubtless been difficulty in raising money with which to ply the tax in addition to that which was requried for the purchasing of food. The last year has, I fear, been a bad one for cattle and many of the people have lost a large proportion of their herds. The whole tax of the District should be about £4400 and only £2769/18 has been paid....








"the year 1897. was not to sproperous as might have been hoped, coming as it does after a year of protected drought and great scaricity of food amongst the natives. / / he weather during the year was favourable for planting, but owing to the presence of the locusts and probably to sarcity of seed, the natives platned mealies but in very small quantities, the main crop bient "mamabele", of which a larger harvest reaped than had been the case for some years past. The \$4t potato crop was also a large one. Good rans fell towards the end of the year, and the 1897-8 season promises for a fair harvenst should the crops excape serious dmamage from the locusts.
