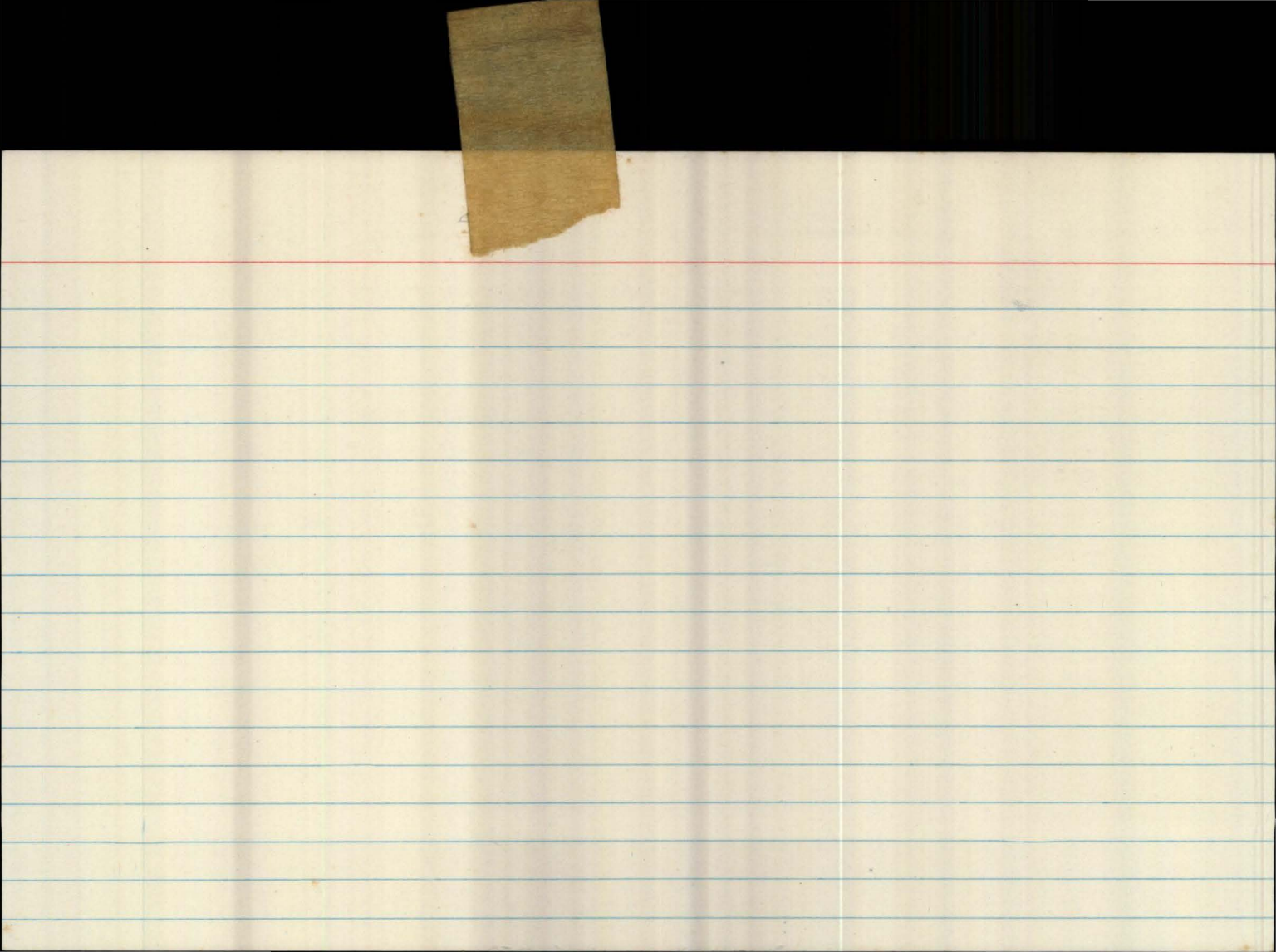

"The number of natives who left the this district seeking employment during 1893, is approximately 1400. The people leave early in January and retrain before May so as to be in time for the payment of Hut tax and state they are mostly employed in the twon of Durban; Some on the Sugar plantations of the Lower Tuguela Division and Victoria County^y Natal, and a few proceed to Johannesburg, where they state they can earn a wage of three pounds...per month as compared with one pound...per month, in Natal, but are deterred from going there from the fact that they are frequently robbed on their return journey to Natal."

"I am directed by the RM Eshowe to instruct you not to issue passes in future to any Zululand woman or girl, unless she be accompanied by some relative of Zululand who must satisfy you that she is going with her fathers or other near relative's knowledge."

Suptdt passes Inyoni to ARM W.W.Barker Eshowe 29/6/93

"I have the honour to place before you a few facts with reference to the issuing of native passes at this place, which will show how difficult it is, on many occasions, to grant passes or to enforce the pass law without the assistance of a native constable.

According to law no passes are supposed to be ~~granted to~~ granted to females without the presence, as witness, of a wellknown man, who can testify to the identity of the woman,

[This doesn't happen, many go straight to the togela / "It is further enacted that all Natal passes have to be vised at Eshowe, irrespective of the destination of the passholder; but on pointing out to the natives the necessity of doing so, I have invariably heard them say, that they were bound for Mr. Dunn's territory, and that they consequently had nothing to do at Eshowe.

.... R. Cnetlly another unknown native wanted a pass for himself and his wife (as he said) and was ordered to bring a witness. This he did a few days afterwards, but, on cross examining the witness and the pass-seeker, it proved that the witness was unacquainted with the woman for whom a pass was wanted, and that the would be witness had been misinformed by the man who wanted the pass. I then heard that the woman in question was on the point of eloping."

1 Fever still prevalent and caused death of Smlomo and many of his kraal. Natives troubled by worms

Two mission stations, ~~people~~ with 141 Christian natives cultivating with European methods.

Country towards Emtohanani, previously occupied by Mzndela's thetwa and Batenjwa of Somopo but abandoned though Nagana and fever, unoccupied. It is about 10x15 miles bounded by Dondota (former Rm site) "where a portion of the Icalax' people live - these people have no cattle keeping only sheep and goats.

This district is specially suited to stock raising, the pasturage being most excellent. It was near the present site of the Magistacy that the Mangwene' kraal (~~Cetewayos~~ (Cetewayos) existed; there the famous white herd of cattle as kept known as 'Inyoni-kai-pumuli'. Having travelled nearly the whole of South Africa, South of the Zambesi, I am of opinion this is the best summer & winter veldt (grass country) I have yet seen.

* "There has continued to be great mortality amongst the natives from fever. /Including Haha/ Eight six deaths have been reported to me during the period under report. Consternation has spread, a believe being entertained that the disease is infectious."

/Report continues like the others No crime/

"Complaints of want of means to pay the hut tax have been frequent but I have replied that I see no sufficient reason for recommending a respite as the people are all possessed of considerable herds of cattle.

I trust there will not be any serious difficulty in obtaining payment but that there will be more difficulty than has been experienced hitherto is certain.

Grain is being offered for sale pretty freely showing that there has been a sufficient harvest"
