"'Somkeli asked me to go before & prepare the way for him to Mr Pretorious, and to state, as regards the force (impi) which stacked the Residency, on the 30th Ultimo, that it was not his ordering but that of Dinuzulu who plressed him by threats to send his men. Somkeli gave strict orders the Residency was not to be attacked but simply uSokwetshata & people."




