/First the extract and then/ "Mr Jan Meek now residing near Helpmekaar, with a Mr Harry Attlee, living now isht his borhter at the Indanda location or mission sta ion, visited the cene of slaughter the next day Jr John Meek making a sketch of the place - showing the position of the slalai and the numbers they found. Mr M gave me this sketch and <sup>1</sup> forwarded it to Mr John Robinson MLC urban.

I do not think Mr Meek will hide any of the facts, he is himself a suffere all his cattle and proeprty having bwen taken by this Dieada, and he could get no redress from the Transvaal Government. I would advise you to wirte to him and you can use the enclosded note. Now with regard to my won case - on Cetshwayo's restoration, Ohman's District having been given back to him, I wrote to Mr Fynn the Resident, ~~acknowledeging the King~~ acknowledging 'the restored King and expressing my willingness to pay any charge he might ask for sawing in the Ingome forest. beofe I recievied an answer the attack was made on Usibepo, and my sons places at the Ingomi Forest were looted by Inyamana people. I hoever staid for a month later till the 8th May at my own residence, during which period I recievied a latter from Mr Fynn the Resdient, to the effect that he had delivered my message to Cetshwayo, who did not seem well incluned towards me, and advising to go and ha e a personal interview with the King. his was impossible as Zululand was then in arms, and travelling was very unsafe. I heard afterwards from some of the Residency policemen that my crime was that I had previous to the Zulu War been Ohams adviser, and against hostilities. that so I had been instrumental in seperating him from the Zulu Nation, and had taken him and his followers to the Kambala to join the British force - all this indictment is true, and I at once saw that byegones we re not going to be so with the restored King, although at that time I was for the sage of peace using all my eneavours to make Oham, acknowledge his brothers rule. Ohan would not and wanted to move into the Reserve, but as soon as a conveyance arrived at his kraal s forhim, the whole of the Usutuhi impi collected and the King sent a message to him <sup>1</sup> at if he did not arrive at his Kraal in 3 days time <sup>0</sup> he would make eat assegais with his teeth, that is would kill him, Oham fled to the Enzothse stronghold and at sundown of the 8th May sent messegers to me advising me to fly as my place would be attacked at daybreak I flegd tha night with my family not saving anything but some cattle - and the next morning hearing s ots fired fled to al hill called the Mquella from which I could see Mnyamans sutu chasing and killing a few of Ohma's men - and loot ng all my propoerty, I was now a fugitive until Usibepo chased Cetshwayo out of Zululand - when Ohma left eh Engotshe stronghod and went to kraal on the Umcos - constant scares and I was living (rather existing in the Inquella strongod when the oers ma e their advent into Zululand - o /I was warned to fely as the Boers wanted to kill me for keepng Hmau stauch to the Englsih Government. Meanwhile Schiel, ombrink went to Z with James Rorke as interpreter/ "on their retrun they said they didnot seehow they could interfere with Usibep ~~xxx~~ or his land, as he was made a constitued Chief with the Englsih overnment at the restoration of Cetshwayo - myself and my sons the n collected what cattle and propoerty we had left and I trexxed with all my family into Usibepos territory as a place of sa ety, my sons memaining behind to collect some cattle that were left - 4 days after wards we had to fly before the Boer and <sup>U</sup>sutu army - and lsot everything but the closthes on our backs and narrowly escaping with our lives."
