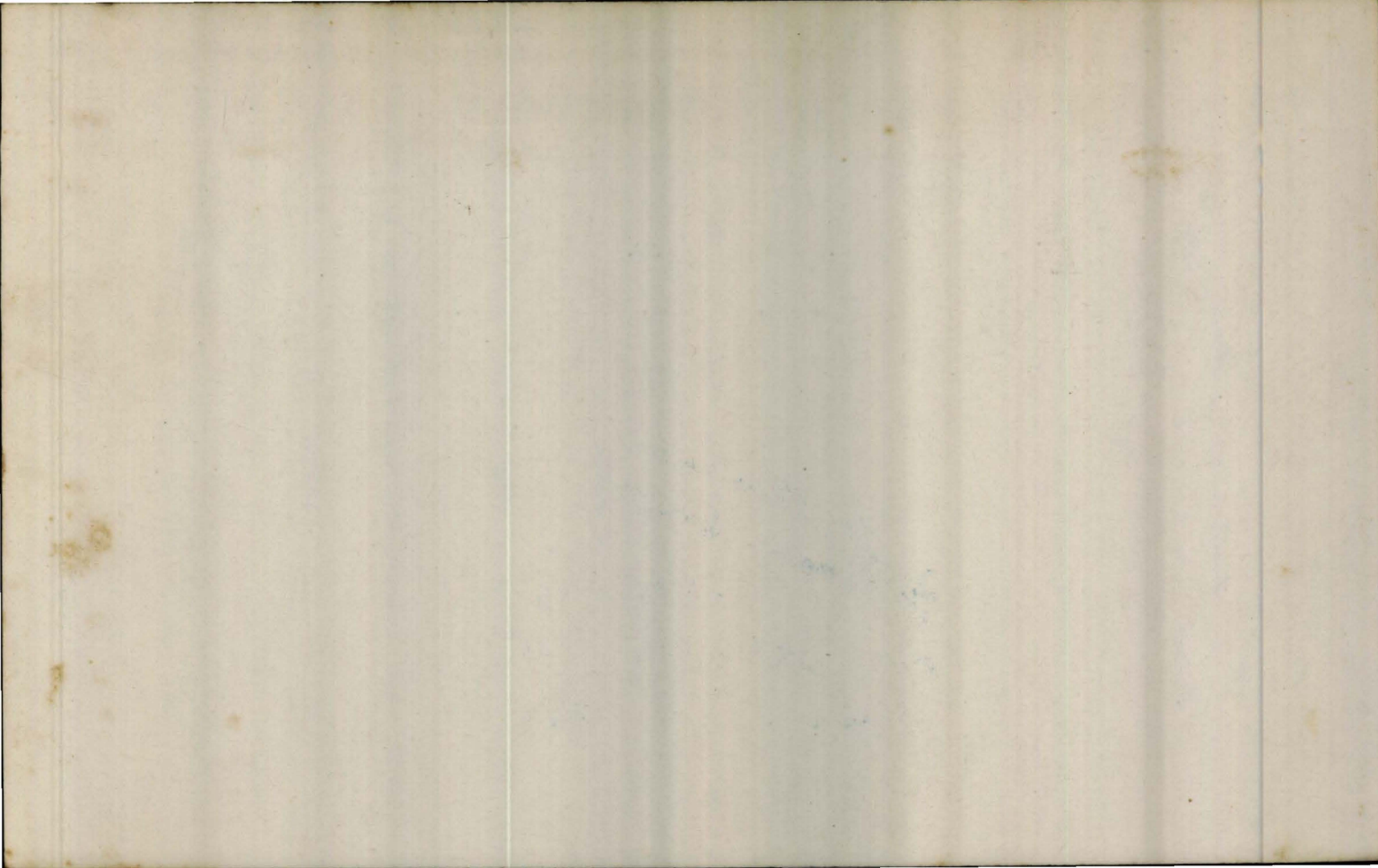

"Johan Colenbrander, in his early twenties, was associated first with Chief Dunn, who gave him an exclusive trading concession and for whom he acted as secretary; and afterwards with Zibhebhu New York Herald, 30 April 1911 (The man that Zulu spears could not kill.)...Once in Dunn's land, he discovered that Dunn was having considerable difficulty in communicating with his ally Zibhebhu. Between them were situated the territories of hostile chiefs. Colenbrander soon found himself engaged frequently in carrying messages between Dunn and Zibhebhu across hundreds of miles of hostile territory. Eventually Dunn recommended him to attach himself to Zibhebhu which he did.....Zibhebhu's ambition was to overrun Swaziland and if possible extend into the Gaza and Mozambique areas. The Zulu War of 1879 prevented the fulfilment of his plan. (Wheelwright to de la Morale 12/4/53) At the time Colenbrander joined Zibhebhu there was little or no industry in Natal, not was trade particularly good. Many of the younger men participated in gun-running for John Dunn particularly for trade among the Zulus (G V Eschery to J Colenbrander 2/7/52) The Zulus had no money but they did possess cattle. Cattle were in demand in Natal, so barter with the Zulus was always remunerative. Zibhebhu himself was



a trader. He would despatch agents through Swaziland, the Eastern Transvaal and even Portuguese East Africa, with merchandise such as beads, blankets, Salampore cloth and brass wire to be exchanged for leopard, civet cat and Insimango monkey-skins which were greatly in demand among the Zulus. Zibheb u paid for his trading goods in cattle and it was cattle which brought men like Johna Colenbrander, Grosvenor Darke and Eckersley to his kraal at Nongoma." /C's store was at Mdaweni kraal 2½ miles from Nongoma. Despite difficulties with horse sickness he organised a cavalry squadron of 25 Zulus.

By 10 am we had 40-50 companies marching to the Denge. 3pm Z myself and 7 horsemen fired on a party and went after them (A version collected from a Zulu alive at the time says the fight occurred when Z and C were going to discuss with Ziwedu Nda uko's taking Dinuzulu from Z's guardianship. Also says that C's store was 2½ miles from Bangonomo.
