

"'I told Captain Poole, R.A., who has the immediate charte of him, to treat him exactly, as far as difference of customs admitted, as he would any European officer of rank who might be in his charge as priosner of war, and I think you may trust Captain Poole to do so...He had begged to have a suit of English clothes. He is very particular about what he gets, and seems well pleased with all that Poole has given him....In all these things, if you can imagine an extremely shrewd, wily, sensual man, with many of the habits, tastes, and ideas of a very vicious, childish lad, who had never mixed with any but flatteres and inferioirs, and had hardly ever known what /345/ it was to be corssed in his will without taking ample vengeance, you will have as good an idea as I can give of him. Long habit of uncontradicted command gives great dignity to his general manner, and takes in casual observers with the belief that he is a very superioir being; but you will look in vain for kingly attribute s , as we understand them, apart from those associated with superioir force and cunning.'"
